The essay examines how habitus acts in people's lives. Starting from the reconstruction of the powerful conceptual architecture developed by Bourdieu around the notion of habitus, we go through the most significant stages of the debate carried out by his defenders and his detractors to bring out some unresolved issues highlighted by the literature developed under the impulse of his theoretical speculation. But beyond the habitus, it marks the desire to avoid one-dimensional readings, which are insufficient to explain the complexity of human agency. The heuristic proposal presented in the essay intends to offer a multidimensional reading of the concept of habitus, to outline the double polarity, never completely overcome, between "destiny" and "project". A paradigmatic change also passes through the need to reconsider both the age-old clash between methodological approaches and the possibility of promoting an ontology of the person.
